Shabbos HaGadol- Redemption through "Teshuvah" or Even Without?

Pesach was the first Redemption of the Children of Israel. One Midrash gives credit for their Redemption to our enslaved ancestors, for resisting the pressure of assimilation, and not changing three aspects of their behavior: their language, their names and their clothing. Another Midrash focuses on the verse which says, "Then I passed over you, and saw you wallowing in your blood, and I said to you, 'In your blood, you shall live,' I said to you, 'In your blood, you shall live.' " (Yechezkel 16:6) In this verse, the two bloods alluded to are the blood of the "Bris Milah" and the "Korban Pesach." Thus it was HaShem, by virtue of His Commands, and not the People on their own, Who made it possible for the People to accrue the merit they needed to qualify for Redemption.

In the last chapter of Maseches Sanhedrin, Perek Chelek, where the word "Chelek" is used in the opening statement, "All of Israel has a portion (or a 'chelek') in the "World-to-Come." The chapter discusses the background of that assertion, plus a multitude of related issues. One of these is a dispute between Rabbi Eliezer and Rabbi Yehoshua, discussed on pages 97b-98a:

"Rabbi Eliezer says, 'If the Jewish People repent, they will be redeemed.' Rabbi Yehoshua said to him, 'If they don't repent, they will not be redeemed, but the Holy One, Blessed is He, will appoint a ruler whose decrees regarding them will be as harsh as were those of Haman, and that will force them to repent.' Another version of the dispute is as follows: 'Rabbi Eliezer says, 'If Israel repents, they will be redeemed, as it says, "Return, O wayward sons, and I will heal your waywardness...' (Yirmiyahu 3:22) But Rabbi Yehoshua replied, 'But has it not also been said, '...For naught were you sold, and without money you will be redeemed' (Yeshayahu 52:3)," where spiritually, sin is foolishness and "money" is "teshuvah," repentance. Both opinions are consistent; Rabbi Eliezer requires repentance, generated by an "arousal from below" - the initiative must come from Israel. Rabbi Yehoshua also requires repentance, but not of the type where the stimulus is created by the human being. For Rabbi Yehoshua, it is sufficient if the arousal for repentance comes "from above." "Without money" means without the usual kind of repentance, that generated "from below." Rather, repentance will be drawn forth "from above" either by a harsh decree, such as the genocidal decree of Haman, as was the case on Purim, or by the Commands of HaShem, as was the case, regarding "Bris Milah" and "Korban Pesach," in the case of the first Pesach.

Rabbi Eliezer and Rabbi Yehoshua go back and forth about ten times until Rabbi Yehoshua cites the verse, "I heard the man clothed in linen, who was above the waters of the river, as he lifted his right hand and his left hand, and swore by the Life Source of the world that after a period, periods and a half, upon the completion of the fragmenting of the hand of the holy people, all these would be finished." (Daniel 12:7). Upon hearing this, the Talmud records that Rabbi Eliezer fell silent. Apparently, the meaning of this somewhat obscure reference is that at a certain time, a test will be made. If the People of Israel has repented on its own, then well and good. But if not, HaShem will arrange events such that repentance will be drawn from the People of Israel, either harshly or with a gentle hand.

The Gemara proceeds to characterize the generation that will witness the arrival of the Mashiach:

"Rabbi Alexandri said, 'Rabbi Yehoshua ben Levi asks, 'It is written that HaShem will deliver the Redemption with deliberate speed, and yet it is also written that HaShem will hasten the Redemption!? The resolution is that if the People of Israel has merit, then the Redemption will be hastened. If they do not, then HaShem will still bring the Redemption, but then it will be brought at a slower, more painful pace." In a similar vein, "Rabbi Alexandri said, 'Rabbi Yehoshua ben Levi noted the contradiction between 'The Son of Man will arrive on Clouds of Heaven' and the source that he will arrive as 'an impoverished Jew, riding on a donkey.' The resolution is 'we get what we deserve.' If the people has merit (and has returned to HaShem of its own free will), then the Redeemer will arrive on 'Clouds of Heaven.' But if they lack merit (and are forced back to HaShem), then the Redeemer will still come, but his entrance onto the stage of history will be much more modest, as it were, as an 'impoverished Jew riding on a donkey.'

May we merit the arrival of our Redeemer in glory!
