Parashios Nitzavim-VaYelech – 5771 – The People of Israel and National Memory

Parashas Nitzavim begins as follows: *“You are standing today, all of you, before HaShem, your G-d: the heads of your tribes, your elders, and your officers – all the men of Israel; your small children, your women, and your proselyte who is in the midst of your camp, from the hewer of your wood, to the drawer of your water. For you to pass into the covenant of HaShem, your G-d, and into His imprecation that HaShem, your G-d, seals with you today. In order to establish you today as a people to Him, and that He be a G-d to you, as He spoke to you and as He swore to your forefathers, to Avraham, to Yitzchak, and to Yaakov. **Not with you alone** do I seal this covenant and this imprecation. But rather with whoever is here, standing with us today before HaShem, our G-d, and **with whoever is not with us today.**”*

The implications of verses 13 and 14 are astounding – namely, that all Jews were present there, in a sense, in the Assembly at “Arvos Moav.” That is, not only the Children of Israel whom Moshe was **addressing directly** at that time, but Jewish People of the past and of the future, till the end of our generations. The only way to understand that idea is to invoke the concept of the eternal “neshomah,” or soul, that animates the human being,, according to verse *Bereshis 1:27, “The Almighty created the human being in His image; in the image of the Almighty did He create him, male and female did He create them.”* And the companion notion that the “neshomah” is a “chelek Elo-ha mima’al,” a “part of the Almighty Above.”

A related idea which is fundamental to Jewish faith is “Techiyas Ha-Mesim,” the “Revival of the Dead.” The Rambam expresses the idea in the last of his “Thirteen Principles of Faith,” “I believe with complete faith that there will be a resuscitation of the dead, whenever the wish emanates from the Creator, Blessed is His Name, and exalted is His mention, forever and for all eternity.”

On one exalted night each year, at the Pesach Seder, we recite, “In every generation one is obligated to view himself as if he himself left Egypt, as it says, *“And you shall tell your son on that day that it was because of these Mitzvos (“Korban Pesach,” “Matzah,” and “Marror”) that HaShem performed miracles for me when I left Egypt. It was not only our ancestors that the Holy One, Blessed is He, redeemed; rather, it was us as well that He redeemed with them, as it says, ‘And He took us out of there, in order to bring us, and to give us the Land which He swore to give to our ancestors.’”* It is not just an exercise in imagination, but a **true recollection**, that we experience on that blessed evening, the “Layl Shimurim,” the Night that HaShem watches over us.

Another momentous occasion which we vividly recall is “Ma’amad Har Sinai,” the “Stand at Sinai” when we received the Torah and encountered HaShem. Moshe describes the event, *“You approached and stood at the foot of the mountain, and the mountain was burning with fire up to the heart of heaven, darkness, cloud and thick cloud. HaShem spoke to you from the midst of the fire; You were hearing the sound of words, but you were **not seeing a form, only a sound...**”* (Devarim 4:11-12)

Our national memory enables us to participate, on certain special occasions, in the history of our People in a manner that transcends time.
