Parashas Vaera— Humanity and the Animal Kingdom

Parashas Vaera features the beginning of the Ten Plagues which struck Egypt. The Animal Kingdom played a role in several of the plagues; particularly in the Plague of "Arov," "all kinds of **bad animals**, and snakes and scorpions in a mixture, and they would attack and destroy the Egyptians;" the definition cited by Rashi from Shemos Rabbah 11:2-3. I think the expression "bad animals" was a state imposed upon them by HaShem, just as "good" and "peaceable" was a state imposed upon them in Gan Eden before the state of wildness was conferred upon them and permission was given to humanity to hunt and eat meat after the "Mabul." And, indeed, it is possible, that the state of "good" and "peaceful" will return to them in Messianic times, as it says, "*Wolf and lamb will graze as one, a lion – like cattle – will eat straw; a snake's food will be dirt; they will not inflict harm nor destruction in all My holy mountain, says HaShem.*" (Yeshayahu 65:25) It is also possible that the spirit of man will change, becoming more "friendly" to animals as animals become more "friendly" to man. See the picture of the author of the book, Man and Beast, Rabbi Natan Slifkin, the "Zoo Rabbi," on its cover with a fierce-looking lion, in a seeming attitude of friendship (!)

The Value of Creatures

In addition to the obvious benefit of animals for their meat or their wool for clothing, we find the following: "Of everything that the Holy One created in His world, He did not create anything in vain. He created the snail as a cure for scabs, the fly as an antidote for hornet stings, the mosquito as an antidote for snakebite, snakes as a cure for sores, and spiders as an antidote for the stings of scorpions." (Shabbos 77b)

"Man's Search for Meaning"

"...In the healthy human, there is a will to meaning, and it is this that sets him apart from the animals. One would never hear an animal ask himself, 'Does my life have meaning?' But this question is asked by *Homo Sapiens*." Viktor Frankl, 1994 Address to the Evolution of Psychotherapy Conference

"Can Animals feel Pain?"

"Rambam, in the context of discussing the prohibition of slaughtering an animal and its young on the same day, writes the following:"

"...the pain of animals is very great; there is no difference between the pain of humans and the pain of other animals in this case (of slaughtering the child in the presence of the mother), for the love of a mother and her compassion upon a child does not depend on the intellect, but rather upon the power of emotion, which is found in most animals just as it is found in man..." Guide for the Perplexed 3:48

"The Way of the World"

"See how wondrously conceived is the nature of the creatures, how many marvelous gifts they possess which show forth the intention of an all-wise Creator, and the will of an omniscient all-powerful Being. He has endowed the small and the great with all necessary internal and external senses and limbs. He gave them organs corresponding to their instincts. He gave the rabbit and the deer the means of flight required by their timid nature; endowed the lion with ferocity and with the instruments for robbing and tearing. He who considers the formation, use and relation of the limbs to the animal instinct, sees wisdom in them, and so perfect an arrangement that no doubt or uncertainty can remain in his soul concerning the justice of the Creator." The Kuzari, 3:11

Human Responsibilities - "How to Kill a Mosquito"

"The primary focus of the requirement to be kind to animals is the human responsibility to practice compassion rather than the animal's right to be treated with compassion. For example, when one does indeed have a halachic license to kill an animal, it should be done in such a way as to minimize the harmful effects upon a person's sensitivities. Thus, **Rabbi Moshe Feinstein (1895-1986)** ruled that if one is killing an insect pest, one should try to avoid doing so with one's bare hands. It makes no difference to the mosquito if it is killed by a fly swatter or one's palm. But to kill it with one's bare hands would increase the personal insensitivity involved."
