Parashas Ki Tzetze Parashas Ki-Setze (21) and Parashas Shophtim (20)

"When you go out to battle..."

Parashas Shophtim

"When you go out to war against your enemy, and you see horse and chariot – a people more numerous than you – you shall not fear them, for HaShem, your God, is with you, Who brought you up from the land of Egypt...Then the officers shall speak to the men, saying: Who is the man who has built a house and has not inaugurated it? Let him go and return to his house, lest he die in the war and another man will inaugurate it... And who is the man who has betrothed a woman and not married her? Let him go and return to his house, lest he die in the war and another man will marry her.' The officers shall continue speaking to the troops and say. 'Who is the man who is fearful and fainthearted? Let him go and return to his house, and let him not melt the heart of his fellows, like his heart." (Devarim 20:1, 5, 7-8) Rashi cites the following disagreement, "Rabbi Akiva says 'The final case is to be understood literally, and refers to a man who cannot stand in the heat of battle and cannot bear to see the outstretched sword. Rabbi Yossi HaGalilli says it refers to a man who knows that he has sins charged against him (and cannot count on the miraculous help of HaShem) and therefore the Torah has mercy on him and gives him the excuses of the 'house, the vineyard and the bride,' allowing him to leave the ranks, and the observer will think that he has one of those other excuses." (Sotah 44a)

Parashas Ki-Setze

Here the Torah weaves a web of circumstance, beginning with the Jewish soldier's lack of control

when he sees a beautiful prisoner-of-war.

"When you will go out to war against your enemies, and HaShem, your God, will deliver them into your hand, and you will capture its captivity; and you will see among its captivity a woman who is beautiful of form, and you will desire her, you may take her to yourself for a wife. You shall bring her to the midst of your house: she shall shave her head and let her nails grow. She shall remove the garment of her captivity from upon herself and sit in your house and she shall weep for her father and for her mother for a full month; thereafter you may come to her and live with her, and she shall be a wife to you. But it shall be that if you do not desire her, then you shall send her on her own, but you may not sell her for money; you shall not enslave her, because you have afflicted her." (Devarim 21:10-14)

The Torah now speaks of the children of two wives – one loved and one hated. The most likely way of such a situation arising is when the Law of the "Yephas Toar," the beautiful captive, is ignored.

"If a man will have two wives, one beloved and one hated, and they bear him sons...and the firstborn son is the hated one's; then it shall be that on the day that he causes his sons to inherit whatever will be his, he cannot give the right of the firstborn to the son of the beloved one, ahead of the son of the hated one ... Rather, he must recognize the firstborn, the son of the hated one, to give him the double portion in all that his found with him; for he is his initial vigor, to him is the right of the firstborn." (Devarim 21:15-17)

The Torah now speaks of a modern tragedy, a son who is way "off the derech," whose fate is to be killed in his youth by pelting him with stones. The Talmud finds so many improbabilities in his story that it is not likely ever to have occurred. Another opinion is that it did occur, despite the many improbabilities. Whatever the case, the Torah is presenting here another likely outcome of the "Yephas Toar."

"If a man will have a wayward and rebellious son, who does not hearken to the voice of his parents, despite their discipline, then his parents grasp him and take him out to the elders of the city and say, 'This son of ours is wayward and rebellious; he does not listen to us; he is a glutton and a drunkard.' All the men of his city shall pelt him with stones and he shall die; and you shall remove the evil from your midst; and all Israel shall hear and they shall fear."
