Parashas Behalosacha 50th Anniversary of Re-Unification of Yerushalyim

Parashas Behaalosecha opens with HaShem's command to Moshe, "Speak to Aharon and say to him, 'When you kindle the lamps, towards the face of the Menorah shall the seven lamps cast light.'

"(BaMidbar 8:2) Paraphrasing, this command can be recast, "When 'Aliyah' is granted to the Jewish People, their emphasis should be directed towards the spiritual center, the City of Yerushalayim." The Anniversary itself was celebrated by a spectacular parade by tens of thousands of Jews, young men and women, and their elder counterparts carrying Israeli flags and dancing towards the Kotel. The Parashah also describes the marching of the Tribes of Israel with their flags. In the Haftarah, we find, "HaShem shall take Yehudah as a heritage to Himself for His portion in the Holy Land, and He shall choose Yerushalayim again." (Zechariah 2:16)

Miriam and I participated in the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the re-unification of Yerushalyim held by the Mizrahi World Movement in the environs of that miraculous event. Participants were given a book, "Jerusalem, Then, Now and Forever," a beautiful historical photo tribute to the Capital of Israel, by the photographer Sharon Gabay, in which pictures and words by Yerushalyim heroes from ancient to current times are wedded. A small selection of the words follows:

Uzi Narkiss (Commander of the IDF units in the Central Region during the Six DayWar): "Silently, I bowed my head. In the narrow space were paratroopers, begrimed, fatigued, overburdened with weapons. And they wept. They were not 'wailing at the Western Wall,' not lamenting in the fashion familiar during the Wall's millennia of being. These were tears of joy, of love, of passion, of an undreamed first reunion with their ancient monument to devotion and prayer. They clung to its stones, kissed them, these rough battle-weary paratroopers, their lips framing the Shema..."

Chaim Weitzman (First President of Israel): "Jerusalem is the eternal mother of the Jewish People, precious and beloved even in its desolation."

Theodore Herzl ("Founder" of Modern Zionism): "Even now, in its desolation, it is a beautiful city. And when the Jews return, it will become one of the world's most beautiful cities." (1898)

Rabbi Aryeh Levin (1885-1969, Poland and Israel); served as a Prison Chaplain, chiefly to members of the pre-State Jewish underground. He devoted his entire life to others, encouraging, comforting and healing broken hearts: "Sometimes, one can see something that would normally take many years, and here you see it in a moment and the whole picture becomes clear in the blink of an eye. An entire period, an entire history, the experience of generations flashes past our eyes in one moment. That is what is happening to us right now, right here. We are entering the Old City, walking to the Kotel, and we are like dreamers..."

Shmuel Yosef Agnon (Israeli Nobel Prize Laureate): "As a result of the historic catastrophe in which Titus of Rome destroyed Jerusalem and Israel was exiled from its land, I was born in one of the cities of the Exile. But always I regarded myself as one who was born in Jerusalem. In a dream, in a vision of the night, I saw myself standing with my brother-Levites in the Holy Temple, singing with them the Songs of David, King of Israel, melodies such that no ear has heard since the day our city was destroyed and its people went into exile. I suspect that the angels in charge of the Shrine of music, fearful lest I sing in wakefulness what I had sung in dream, made me forget by day what I had sung at night; for if my brethren, the sons of my people, were to hear, they would be unable to bear their grief over the happiness they have lost. To console me for having prevented me from singing with my mouth, they enable me to compose songs in writing."

Rabbi Shlomo Goren (1917-1994, Poland and Israel): "Israeli soldiers, beloved of the nation, decorated with courage and victory, May G-d be with you, valiant heroes. The dream of all generations has come true before our eyes. The city of G-d and the place of the Temple...symbols of the Messianic redemption of our nation, have been redeemed this day by you, heroes of the Israel Defense Forces. Today you have fulfilled the oath of the generations - 'If I forget you, O Jerusalem, may my right hand forget its cunning.'"

Yitzhak Rabin (1922-1995), was an Israeli Prime Minister, statesman and general, until his assassination in 1995: "Jerusalem has a thousand faces, and each of us has his own Jerusalem. My Jerusalem is Doctor Moshe Wallach of Germany, the doctor who built the Shaarei Tzedek Hospital and built his own apartment in the hospital's back yard to be close to his patients day and night. I was born in that hospital - I am a Jerusalemite. My Jerusalem is the center of yearning and the place of dreaming for the Jewish People...My Jerusalem is the City of Peace, from which the great calls will go out to all religions and nations: "For from Zion the Torah will come forth, and the word of HaShem from Jerusalem" (Isaiah 2:3)...In Israel there is one topic about which there is no argument: Jerusalem's unity...the city which was destroyed eight times in history...was always ours, and always will be!"
