Parashas-Pikudei Completion of the Mishkan and the Purpose of Man

Parashas Pekudei is the last parashah in Sefer Shemos and is joined with Parashas Parah and its Haftarah. It marks the completion of the process of Redemption from the first exile in Jewish History. As a people, we learned many things from the period of slavery. Perhaps the most important of the lessons was not to abuse our fellow human beings. From our Redemption we also learned great lessons. They were that HaShem is all-powerful and that He is a Moral Force in History, and that He chose the Jewish People to receive the Torah, His Creation, and our Constitution and Charter to be His representative in teaching morality to the nations of the world.

It also describes the Mishkan, the Dwelling Place of HaShem in His World. For as large as that world is, it is but a dot in His Infinite Universe, the only place of Life in that vast cosmos, into which its Creator was "Metzamtzem," Contracted, His Infinite Self to be with us. And we learned the vastness of the human potential, for Moshe, our Teacher, was able to commune with HaShem for forty days and nights, and receive the Torah and teach it to our ancestors who taught it to us in an unbroken Chain of Tradition.

And it was Moshe who completed the work of the "Mishkan:"

"Moshe saw the entire work, and behold! They had done it as HaShem had commanded, so had they done! And Moshe blessed them." (Shemos 39:43)

"It was in the first month of the second year on the first of the month that the Tabernacle was erected. Moshe erected the Tabernacle...He erected the courtyard all around the Tabernacle and the Altar, and he emplaced the curtain of the gate of the courtyard. So Moshe completed the work." (Shemos 40:17-18, 33)

In the footnote of the Art/Scroll Chumash, we find, "The glory of G-d rested upon the handiwork of Man, in full sight of every man, woman and child. Until then, God had shown them His miracles and embraced them in His closeness, but that was an undeserved or barely deserved gift. Now they would see their Tabernacle enveloped in holiness, the Tabernacle that was built with their hands, erected by their prophet, made possible by their repentance, assuring them that God's presence would remain forever in their midst – if they would but continue to make it welcome."

Parashas Parah:

The special Maftir for Parashas Pekudei is Parashas Parah. The major theme of the Parashah is that holiness is within the reach of every Jewish individual. There is a paradox in connection with the Law of the Red Cow, which focuses primarily on the fact that the ashes of the cow confer holiness on the sinner, but those who were involved in its preparation become contaminated. In other words, *"Who can draw a pure thing out of an impure thing? Is it not the One God? (Iyov 14:4)* And Shlomo HaMelech declared, *"I said I would be wise, but it is far from me." (Koheles 7:23)*

In the Haftarah of Parashas Parah, we find, *"I shall take you from the nations and gather you in from all the countries, and I shall bring you to your land. And I shall sprinkle upon you pure water, that you be cleansed...and I shall give you a new heart, and a new spirit shall I put within you; I shall remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh...I, HaShem have spoken and acted...I shall increase them - the men - like sheep. Like the sheep for the Divine service, like the sheep of Yerushalayim on her festivals...and they shall know that I am Ha-Shem." (Yechezkel 24-26, 37-38)*
